

American Legion Post 449, like all other Posts, exists principally for the use and enjoyment of their respective Veteran





### V.A. News & Info.....

- 1 The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has announced that it is now able to fund care for all veterans with Hepatitis C for Fiscal Year 2016 regardless of the stage of the patient's liver disease. The move follows increased funding from Congress along with reduced drug prices. Treatment priority is established for the sickest patients. Also, if veterans are currently waiting on an appointment for community care through the Choice Program, they can now turn to their local VA facility for this treatment or can elect to continue to receive treatment through the Choice Program. VA expects that with the expansion, many more Veterans will be started on Hepatitis C treatment every week.
- 2 Members of a congressionally appointed Commission on Care, many of whom are medical industry executives, are reportedly pushing lawmakers in Washington to support long-term plans to accelerate privatization of VA health care. American Legion National Commander Dale Barnett says such a proposal

seriously undermines the committee's purpose - develop a 20year strategy to provide timely, high-quality care for veterans who use Department of Veterans Affairs services - and raises conflict-of-interest concerns when those promoting privatization stand to gain financially if that becomes VA's future.

3 - The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has announced that its Beneficiary Fiduciary Field System has allowed it to identify claim processing errors affecting approximately 14,000 veterans and survivors. These veterans' and survivors' claims were initially filed over many years. The errors concern cases in which VA had proposed that due to disability or age the beneficiary was unable to manage his or her VA benefits without assistance, but did not complete the action by transferring it within VA for appointment of a fiduciary. VA's Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA) has set up a team to immediately review the cases, notify beneficiaries, complete the claim processing steps, and appoint a fiduciary as quickly as possible.



### **BEWARE OF AUTOMATED CALL FROM THE VA: SCAM**

American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Wisconsin

#### Please spread the word to our Veterans!

Please help them protect their information. The VA does NOT have an automated system that CALLS YOU and requires you to punch in your personal information/Social Security Number for any reason. Last week one of our Veterans received a telephone call requesting their Social Security Number be punched into an automated system. According to the VAAAHS Privacy Officer, this is occurring across multiple government agencies and locations. Please advise our Veterans to hang up and report the incident by contacting the VAAAHS Privacy Officer, Julie Lowery, at (734) 845-5314.

All VA automated systems that request information require Veterans to call that service; no VA automated system will call a Veteran and require information be entered into that system. An example of this is prescription renewal through the VA's automated pharmacy prescription renewal service. The VA offers multiple ways to renew prescriptions. Myhealthevet, for example, is an online service only. Through Myhealthevet, a Veteran must log onto the website to renew a prescription online. Some Veterans choose to call the pharmacy to renew a prescription utilizing the pharmacy's automated prescription renewal system. In this case, the Veteran is asked to enter their personal information including their Social Security Number; however, the Veteran must call the pharmacy. The pharmacy's automated system does NOT call the Veteran.



The 7 acts of corporal mercy are listed as follows- can you help? These are all charitable actions by which we help our neighbors (veterans) in their bodily needs.


- 1. Feed the Hungry did you put food in the food barrels yet?


